The Honorable Julian E. Jones, 4th District Councilman

Julian provided an overview his family life and his community service life. He has been with the A A County Fire Department for 31 years. His most memorable event was heading a Maryland Contingent sent to Louisiana during Katrina. As 4th District Councilman, Julian has a laundry list of periods including:

- 1. Increasing the fines on dumping
- 2. Increasing the fines on businesses for not clearing snow from sidewalks on Liberty Road.
- 3. Installing sidewalks on Windsor Mill Road
- 4. Multitude of upgrades to Randallstown High School
- 5. Paying close attention to Metro Centre
- 6. Paying close attention to Owings Mills Mall

- 8. Paying attention to Lifebridge expansion
